Statistical agency Statistics Sweden provides society with statistics for decision-making, debate and research. We do so on behalf of the government, authorities, researchers, and business and industry. Our statistics contribute to fact-based social debate and well-founded decisions.

After the testimonies that emerged during the #metoo movement, Karolinska Institutet has, together with KTH Royal Institute of Technology, Malmö University, and the Swedish Secretariat for Gender Research at the University of Gothenburg, established a research and collaboration programme. Within the scope of the programme, Statistics Sweden has been tasked with conducting a national survey on sexual harassment and gender-based violence.

The purpose of the survey is to gain an understanding of what form sexual harassment takes within higher education institutions and the consequences thereof for both individual career opportunities and academia as employer, education provider, and knowledge organisation.

Who uses the responses, and how?

When the data processing is completed by Statistics Sweden, anonymized data will be delivered to Karolinska Institutet for further processing and analysis.

Karolinska Institutet may also provide data from the survey to other researchers. The provision of data to external parties is restrictive and subject to a specific assessment. Such research and statistical aims are also covered by statistical confidentiality.

To avoid unnecessary data collection, we will retrieve data already available at Statistic Sweden from current registers. We retrieve data regarding gender, age, country of birth and what university or college you are accepted to or employed at.

So that you do not need to respond to information already available at Statistics Sweden, we retrieve information regarding gender, age, country of birth and information about your university and your studies or employment there.

Collected data will be stored for 3 months after the assignment is completed. 3 months after completion, data will be completely cleared.

For the possibility to add current register information to the dataset later, Statistics Sweden will store a link between serial number and identity.

How are my responses protected?

When the results of the survey are presented, how you specifically responded will not be shown.

Data regarding individuals' personal and financial circumstances are protected by confidentiality and everybody working with the survey must observe professional secrecy. Confidentiality applies according to Chapter 24, Section 8 of the Public Access to Information and Secrecy Act (2009:400).

The same confidentiality applies at Karolinska Institutet.

How is personal data handled?

Statistics Sweden is the personal data controller for the handling of personal data that is processed by Statistics Sweden. Karolinska Institutet is the personal data controller for the handling of personal data that is processed by Karolinska Institutet.

Regulations on the handling of personal data are found in the EU General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR), the Official Statistics Act (2001:99) and the Official Statistics Ordinance (2001:100). In addition, there are also rules in the Data Protection Act (2018:218) and the regulations issued in connection with that Act.
